Travel across centuries and feel the ancient Ashiya.

1. Ashiya Shrine/ 1-B The Tomb of Sarumaru Dayu

The shrine has numerous azaleas, the official city flower of Ashiya and plenty of trees, such as Japanese black and red pines within its site.

The lateral chamber tomb of the late *Kofun* period of approx. 1400 years ago remains within the site.

The tomb of Sarumaru Dayu, a member of the 36 Famous Poets of the early *Heian* Era, also remains here.

2. YODOKO Guest House 2-C (Former residence of the Yamamura Family)

A guest house made of geometrically patterned *Oya* stones. Completed in 1924. The original design is by Frank Lloyd Wright who also designed the old Tokyo Teikoku Hotel. The guest house is an only architecture in Japan by Wright remained in its original state. Amazing views of Ashiya city and Osaka bay can be seen from the site.

It was designated as one of Important Cultural Properties of Japan in 1974.

3. Water Wheel Mortar Ruin

In Ashiya district in the *Edo* Era, it was common to polish rice in a stream of the Ashiya-gawa River using a water wheel.

Nowadays, this history is remembered in millstones found at private homes and in the name of this area, *Suishadani*, Water Wheel Valley.







In early spring, you can see cherry blos-

soms blooming beautifully and near the charming babbling of Ashiyagawa River.





4. Tekisui Museum of Art

In 1964, a former house was renovated into the museum collecting Kyoto ware and Kishu ware.

Tekisui Museum of Art exhibits antique arts and crafts such as porcelain, dolls and Japanese card games all collected by Kichirobe Yamaguchi, the economical leader in Kansai area before the war.

5. Koza Waterfalls/ 1-A Relief of Kuzo Fujiki

The Koza Waterfalls are a pair of 10-meter

There is a relief of the climber Kuzo Fujiki immediately to the left of the waterfall rocks. Kuzo Fujiki is known as the pioneer of Modern climbing technology and the one who gave Ashiya Rock Garden its name.


6. Egenoyama Ruins

The Egenoyama Ruins were unearthed in 1954.

Vestiges of ancient residences, graves, ritual places and so on from the Yayoi Era of approx 2000 years ago were found here. Some of the artifacts are now on display in the Ashiya City Museum of Art and History.

The Egenoyama Ruins have been developed as an archaeological park.

Designated as one of the official historic sites of the prefecture in 2011.


